



Bruce D. Campbell

June 14, 1939 - October 3, 2014

Bruce Delano Campbell was born on June 14, 1939 in Saint Louis, Missouri. He was the third child born to the union of Jasper Calvin and Mary Brunet (Manns) Campbell. His parents, Jasper and Mary, and his two brothers, Sylvester Donald, Robert Lee and his sister, Pauletta Gloria Dade, preceded him in death.

He attended the Saint Louis Public Schools.

Bruce was drafted in the United States Army during the Vietnam War and served in the Active Military Service from April 1962 to May 1964, and in the United States Army Reserves until 1970. He was Honorably Discharged.

Mr. Campbell was employed during his earlier years with Edison Brothers Shoe Stores Inc., and the United States Army Troop Support Command in Saint Louis, Missouri. He later became a self-employed contractor.

Bruce enjoyed playing pool and loved all types of sports. His favorite holiday was "Christmas." He also loved to take time out to go feed and care for his little animal friends: the dogs, the cats, the birds, etc. One of Bruce's favorite greetings was, "Hello Governor."

Due to his mother's sanctification and love for God, Bruce was raised up in Holiness. He expressed a hope in Christ at an early age. He loved to listen to

great musicians who played the piano, whether it was Jazz or Gospel.

Bruce Campbell departed this life on Friday October 3, 2014, while in Barnes-Jewish Hospital Emergency Room.

He leaves to cherish his memory, two brothers: Melvin and Danny; one sister: Mary; one sister-in-law: May Rose; one son: Bruce D. Madison; one daughter-in-law: Pamela Madison, and her son and daughter: Jordin and Cora; one mother-in-law: Patricia Graham; two daughters: Tammy and Toni; and a host of cousins, nieces, nephews, relatives and friends.
