January 29, 1930 - April 26, 2021

Eddie Turner (affectionately known as Mr. Turner) was born January 29, 1930, in Brownsville, TN to Bennie Turner (08/12/1897 - 03/01/1966) and Annie Sue Vaulx Turner (10/17/1898 - 05/06/1979). He was one of 15 children - seven brothers and seven sisters. He received his education in the Haywood County, TN Public school system before joining and honorably serving in the United States Army in 1952 (Korean War). A firm believer in God, Mr. Turner received Jesus Christ as his personal Lord and Savior at an early age.
