



## Eddie "Goo" Wilson

December 27, 1968 - January 7, 2023

Eddie Antwann Wilson (affectionately known as "Goo"), was born on December 27, 1968, to the union of Eddie Wilson Sr. and Mary Frances Monroe, who both preceded him in death. He was born and raised in Richmond Heights in Saint Louis, Missouri, which is also where he professed his faith in Christ at an early age. After his mother's untimely death, his aunt Bernice Monroe, fulfilled the maternal roll for Eddie and his older brother Terrell. They were abundantly loved and spoiled by Aunt Bernie as she was lovingly called. Both preceded him death.

During Eddie's early adolescence he excelled academically and athletically due to being a fast learner and his natural athleticism. He was hugely into sports, especially basketball and football, and delivered sports commentary on a professional level. Growing up two of his favorite sports players were Earvin "Magic" Johnson and Deion Sanders. He always wore the number 32 on his jersey to represent Magic. Goo was an avid Dallas Cowboys fan because of Deion Sanders athleticism and electric performances on the field.

Eddie was a graduate of Maplewood-Richmond Heights Senior High School, where he maintained a high grade point average. He was fun-loving, opened his heart to many friends, and enjoyed a full social life. Eddie was a member of the men's varsity basketball and football teams. He was a rising star on the gridiron and became a recruit due to his football IQ, leadership skills, and

physical gifts. During this time, he also welcomed his only child, Brittnee, who was given the nickname Boo to rhyme with Goo.

After graduating from high school, Eddie joined the United States Army. He was stationed in Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. Eddie's commanding officers boasted that he was a standout performer in his enlistment class. His personality always changed the room and you could always count on his nonstop humor. Goo was no stranger to the kitchen and enjoyed putting his own special twist on traditional recipes. Over the years, Eddie and his family were often stopped by classmates, coaches, and spectators that fondly remembered (in detail) how well he played football and as well as his intellect. He leaves many memories in our hearts and spirits of how truly one of a kind he was. Eddie's family misses him dearly and will never forget his beautiful chestnut brown eyes.

He leaves to cherish: his daughter Brittnee Lauren White, two sisters Nutressa Monroe and Mary Monroe, two nephews Max Davis Jr, and Aiden Monroe, uncles, aunts, nephews, cousins, and a host of friends that were extended family. Eddie will be laid to rest with his Grandmother Hattie Frances, his Mother Mary Frances, his Aunt Bernice, and Uncle John at Cavalry Cemetery.

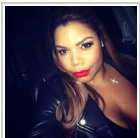

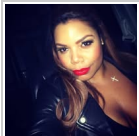

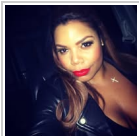
