Mary Will Hendrix (nee Ferguson) was born on May 11, 1941, in Lowndes County, Mississippi, to Sylvester “Honey” and Mary Lee Ferguson, both of whom preceded her in death.

Mary received her education through the Columbus Municipal School District in Columbus, Mississippi. She attended Mitchell Memorial Elementary School and went on to graduate from Robert E. Hunt High School in 1961.

Throughout her school years, she was an avid reader and enjoyed home economics. After graduation, Mary moved to St. Louis, Missouri and met the love of her life, James “Sonny” Hendrix, Jr.
