Mother Vertia Johnson Moore was born in Belzoni, Mississippi to the late Mary Jo Ray Johnson and the late King Johnson, Sr. Her father, a preacher and a farmer, passed away when she was twelve years of age. Along with their mom, the family of 4 brothers and 2 sisters moved to St. Louis, Missouri where they received their elementary and secondary education. Her father, mother, and six of her siblings have preceded her in death. Her brother, Jim, a retired and renowned architect, now lives in Houston, Texas.

Mother Moore was married to the Late, Great, Bishop Dr. Willie B. Moore for 61 years and served as the First Lady of Faith Temple Church for the same number of years. Their union garnered eleven children of which 8 ministers: 5 sons and 3 daughters have been birthed. She was under the leadership of her 7th born child, and 4th son, Elder Charles E. Moore at her death. She has 24 grandchildren and 25 great-grandchildren.

Mother Moore's life paralleled Proverbs; a mother, a lady, and an example. She possessed the ability to express the love of God in her smile and was crowned with wisdom. She had the unique ability to make everyone feel special and important. A qualified woman of the gospel, she expounded the Word of God to edify, under the anointing of the Holy Ghost.
