### Virginia's Life Reflection

On November 22, 1930 God looked upon the earth and decided to bless William Neal and Georgia Flowers of Brighton, Tennessee with a bouncing baby girl, who they so lovely named Virginia Neal. Virginia was one of twenty-three children; she was preceded in death by all of her siblings.

Virginia moved to St. Louis, Missouri in 1951 to create a better life for her and her children, James Neal (who preceded her in death) and Lula Montgomery. Virginia, having only an elementary education, knew that she needed to provide for her children. She quickly learned the trade of pressing in various cleaners and uniform factories in St. Louis. She retired after 37 years of service. Two years after her retirement, Virginia decided to go back to work as a home health care aide for 3 years.

On July 17, 1976, Virginia united in Holy Matrimony to John William Hill and this union lasted until his death in 1989. Virginia never remarried but decided to invest more time in her grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She made sure they were taught in the fear and admonition of the Lord, making sure they attended church regularly.

Virginia gave her life to God at an early age quickly united in fellowship with Morning Star Missionary Baptist Church. As a member of Morning Star,

Virginia sang in the church choir and served on the usher board. She later became a member of New Beginning Missionary Baptist Church where she served on the Mother's Board and also served in whatever capacity she was needed.
